4 **Open windows before bed**



How to Clean Your Bathroom Exhaust Fan

A bathroom exhaust fan is often an afterthought for homeowners but is necessary to remove excess moisture from the space, reducing the chance for mold and mildew growth. Here is a step-by-step process of how to clean your exhaust fan to ensure it runs optimally.

1 Remove the vent cover
First, turn off the power to the fan. For extra security, turn off the circuit at the breaker box. If the vent cover has a light, disconnect the wire first by pressing the release tab on the connector before removing the vent cover. If the vent has no light, remove the vent cover by softly pulling down on it, then squeezing the metal mounting wires together on both sides. Then, slide the wires out of their slots, fully removing them from the fan housing.


2 Clean the vent cover
Fill your bathroom sink with warm water and

a few drops of dish detergent. Soak the cover in the cleaning solution, then scrub it with a brush or cloth to remove dirt and debris. Once finished, place the cover on and towel and let it air dry. If your vent cover has a light, do not submerge it in water. Vacuum off the dust, wipe it with a damp cloth and then air dry.

3 Clean the fan without removing the motor
Use a vacuum with a crevice attachment to remove the dust. Switch to a brush attachment for the motor components and fan housing, if needed. Once the

dust is removed, take a damp microfiber cloth and wipe down the fan components and housing to remove any remaining dirt.

4 Remove the motor for deep cleaning
To remove the fan motor, unplug the connector or plug powering the fan. Next, remove the mounting screws that hold the motor. Hold the motor with one hand while using the other to remove the motor from the housing. Vacuum the motor or force air to blow the dust from the motor and fan blades. Use a small, soft bristle brush to remove caked-on dust if needed. Wipe down the



motor, fan blades and housing using a damp microfiber cloth.

5 Reassemble the exhaust fan
Place the motor back in and replace the screws. Plug in the fan, then put the vent cover back on by inserting the mounting wires into their slots, and gently push the cover into place.
